While at the duck trap we also worked on ziptying some sections that needed it. The wader and breeding passerine surveyor for this spring, Jochem Verweij, arrived today (JVJ. Bergschenhoek, The Netherlands). He will be staying until mid June. KWL made a lovely traditional french dinner for the station and the kommitté (kig ha farz).
